

Air Marshal Tejinder Singh takes over as **Deputy Chief of the Air Staff**

- Air Marshal Tejinder Singh took over as Deputy Chief of the Air Staff of the Indian Air Force in New Delhi.
- Educational Background: He is an alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Defence Service Staff College, and National Defence College.
- Commissioning: He was commissioned into the fighter stream of the IAF on 13 June 1987.
- Flying Experience: He is a Category 'A' Qualified Flying Instructor with over 4,500 hours of flying experience.
- Command Positions: Fighter Squadron, Radar Station, Premier Fighter Base & Served as Air Officer Commanding in Jammu and Kashmir
- Awards: He was awarded the Vayu Sena Medal in 2007 and the Ati Vishisht Seva Medal in 2022.
- Role: The Deputy Chief of the Air Staff (DCAS) assists the Chief of the Air Staff in overseeing air force operations, strategy, and administration. They play a key operational planning, policy development, role in resource management, and personnel oversight, while also serving as a key advisor and liaison with other military branches and international partners.

Preethi Pal Makes History with Bronze and Nishad Kumar Wins Silver at Paris **Paralympics 2024**

- Indian Para Athlete Preethi Pal won a Bronze medal in the Women's 200 meters – T35 Final at the Paris Paralympics 2024.
- She achieved a personal best timing of 30.01 seconds to secure the medal.
- Historic Achievement: Preethi Pal became the first Indian woman Para Athlete in track and field to win two medals at the Paralympics.
- Other Indian Success: Indian athlete Nishad Kumar won a silver medal in the Men's High Jump – T47 event with a jump of 2.04 meters.
- As of the 2024 Paris Paralympics, India has secured a total of seven medals, including one gold, two silvers, and four bronze medals.

old International Master Mayank year Chakraborty wins his 2nd Grand Master Norm in Greece

- 15-year-old Chess International Master (IM) Mayank Chakraborty from Assam won his second Grand Master (GM) Norm in a tournament in Greece.
- Path to Grand Master: He requires one more GM Norm and must reach a FIDE rating of 2500 to become a Grand Master, which would make him the first from North East India.
- Current Rating: His current FIDE rating is 2431.
- Status: International Master Mayank became an International Master in April 2024 and currently holds the highest number of GM Norms and the highest FIDE rating in North East India.
- Other Contender: IM Sahil Dey, 17, is also competing to be the first Grand Master from North East India, with one GM Norm and a FIDE rating of 2375.

India's notable chess International Masters include:

- Manuel Aaron India's first IM in 1961.
- Dibyendu Barua IM in 1983, later became India's second Grandmaster.
- Viswanathan Anand Achieved IM in 1985, later became India's first Grandmaster and World Chess Champion.
- Pravin Thipsay IM in the 1980s, later a Grandmaster.
- Vijayalakshmi Subbaraman First Indian woman to become an IM in 2001.

New Zealand's Māori King Tuheitia dies

- The Māori king in New Zealand Kiingi Tuheitia Pōtatau Te Wherowhero VII has died peacefully at age 69
- Early Life: Born Tüheitia Paki in 1955.
- Reign: Crowned as king in 2006 following the death of his mother, Te Arikinui Dame Te Atairangikaahu.
- Role and Influence: Like his mother, King Tuheitia was a significant unifying figure for the Māori people, advocating for unity in the face of policies targeting Māori communities.

Background:

The Māori are the indigenous Polynesian people of New Zealand, organized into various tribes (iwi) such as Ngāpuhi and Ngāti Porou. They have a rich cultural heritage that includes traditions like the haka, and their language, Te reo Māori, is an official language of New Zealand. Māori society is centered around marae (communal spaces) and has a complex social structure involving chiefs and priests.

Indian Navy's P-8I Joins INS Tabar for 22nd Indo-French Exercise Varuna

- The Indian Navy's P-8I aircraft has reached France for its first-ever deployment in Europe.
- Exercise Varuna: The aircraft will participate in the 22nd edition of 'Exercise Varuna,' an Indo-French bilateral naval exercise.
- **Dates and Location:** The 2024 edition of Exercise Varuna is scheduled from September 2 to September 4 in the Mediterranean Sea.
- Objective: The exercise aims to deepen synergy and interoperability between the Indian and French navies through advanced tactical exercises.
- Significance: Exercise Varuna is a key component of the strategic relationship between India and France in the 21st century.
- Participants: INS Tabar will also participate in the exercise alongside the P-8I aircraft.
- Scope: The exercise includes naval cooperation drills, focusing on capabilities like cross-deck operations, replenishment-at-sea, and information sharing.
- **Inception:** Exercise Varuna was first conducted in 1983, but it became a regular feature of the India-France strategic partnership in 2001, reflecting the growing defense ties between the two countries.
- Historical Context: This deployment marks a return after a 63-year gap.

approves 93.6 million Cambodia's rural water supply, sanitation

- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) approved 93.6 million U.S. dollars in loans and grants to improve climate-resilient and inclusive WASH (water supply, sanitation, and hygiene) facilities in Cambodia.
- Program Coverage: The initiative will benefit 88,000 households across nine provinces, aiming to support government efforts to achieve universal access to safe water supply services and basic hygiene facilities in rural areas.
- Sanitation Focus: The program will also improve access to safely managed sanitation facilities, particularly focusing on affordability.
- Special Grant: A 3-million-dollar grant included to expand WASH facilities in provinces where poor rural residents struggle most with access to safe water, sanitation, and hygiene.
- Technical Assistance: A 600,000-dollar technical assistance component will enhance the government's capacity to implement key sector reforms under the program.

Iran unveils domestically upgraded M60 tank

- Iran unveiled a domestically upgraded version of which M60 tank, higher the features maneuverability and destructive power.
- The tank is equipped with a weaponry fire control system, a coaxial machine gun, and a two-degreemotion platform carrying of-freedom commander's machine gun.
- Tt is also armed with a new commander's turret, reactive armor, infrared jamming, telecommunication and anti-modern warfare systems, smoke grenades, and rear-, front-and side-view cameras, as well as fire alarm and suppression systems.
- The M60 tank is an American battle tank developed in the 1950s and introduced into service in 1960.
- **Design and Development:** The M60 designed as a successor to the M48 Patton tank, incorporating improved armor and firepower. It features a 105mm gun and enhanced armor protection. www.race4job.com

Cabinet approves seven agricultural projects worth Rs 13,966 crore

- To boost India's agricultural sector, the Union Cabinet approved seven major projects with a combined investment of Rs 13,966 crore. The announcement was made by Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw where he outlined the government's commitment to advancing agricultural research, digital farming, and sustainable practices.
- This announcement comes a week after Vaishnaw revealed the approval of 12 industrial smart cities across 10 states worth Rs 28,602 crore.
- Crop Science for Food and Nutritional Security: Rs 3,979 crore allocated to enhance crop science for improved food security and nutrition.
- Agricultural Education and Management: Rs 2,291 crore set aside for modernizing agricultural education and ICAR, integrating digital management under infrastructure, AI, big data, and climate resilience measures.
- Digital Agriculture Mission: Rs 2,817 crore allocated to integrate AI and big data into agriculture for better decision-making and efficiency.
