INTERNATIONAL

1) Climate Indicators and Sustainable Development

The World Meteorological Organization has published a new report on Climate Indicators and Sustainable Development: Demonstrating the Interconnections. WMO studied seven climate indicators — carbon dioxide concentration, temperature, ocean acidification and heat, sea ice extent, glacier melt and sea-level rise.

NATIONAL

1) Medical Devices Parks Schemes

The Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers has launched the Scheme for "Promotion of Medical Device Parks" to support the medical devices industry in line with Atmanirbhar Bharat. The medical device industry is a unique blend of engineering and medicine. It involves the creation of machines that are used to support life within the human body.

2) "Bijoya Sanskritik Mahotsav"

Indian Army will organize "Bijoya Sanskritik Mahotsav" in Kolkata. This Mahotsav will be observed to mark the golden jubilee of the India-Pak war 1971. It will be organized as part of the Swarnim Vijay Varsha celebrations to commemorate the golden jubilee of the India-Pak war.

STATE NEWS

1) Social accountability law

A State-wide campaign has been launched in Rajasthan for demanding passage of the social accountability law in the next Assembly session. It has been defined as an approach towards ensuring accountability that relies on civic engagement, i.e., in which ordinary citizens and citizen groups participate directly or indirectly in exacting accountability.

2) Goa government's Feni Policy 2021

The Goa Feni Policy 2021 has paved the way to take the GI Certified Goan Cashew Feni forward at par with other international Liquors such as Mexico's tequila, Japanese Sake and Russia's Vodka. The Goa government in 2016 classified Feni as the Heritage Spirit of Goa.

3) World's highest electric vehicle charging station

The world's highest electric vehicle charging station has been inaugurated in Kaza village of Lahaul and Spiti district in Himachal Pradesh. The electric vehicle charging station is set up at a height of 500 ft. The aim of this initiative is to check vehicular pollution and promote electric vehicles for a clean and green environment in the region.

A report titled Environmental performance of blue foods has stated that the Aquatic or blue foods can be made more environmentally sustainable than they are now. Blue foods are food derived from aquatic animals, plants or algae that are caught or cultivated in freshwater and marine environments.

2) WHO air quality guidelines

The World Health Organisation has announced a tight revision in its air quality guidelines. This is the first revision in the global air quality by WHO since 2005. In the new guidelines, WHO has lowered the acceptable exposure levels to key pollutants, including ozone, nitrogen dioxide, sulfur dioxide, carbon monoxide and particulate matter.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

1) Electronic Microchip

Northwestern University in US has created an Electronic Microchip or Microflier with the capability of flight. It is the smallest-ever human-made flying structure. It is about the size of a grain of sand and does not have a motor or engine. It is ideal for monitoring Air Pollution and Airborne Disease.

2) Privateer Space

Apple's co-creator Steve Wozniak has launched a new space start-up called Privateer Space, bringing potential competition to a field dominated by billionaires Elon Musk, Jeff Bezos and Richard Branson. Mr Wozniak co-founded Apple Computers in 1976.
